Our pupils are at the heart of our PSHE curriculum.

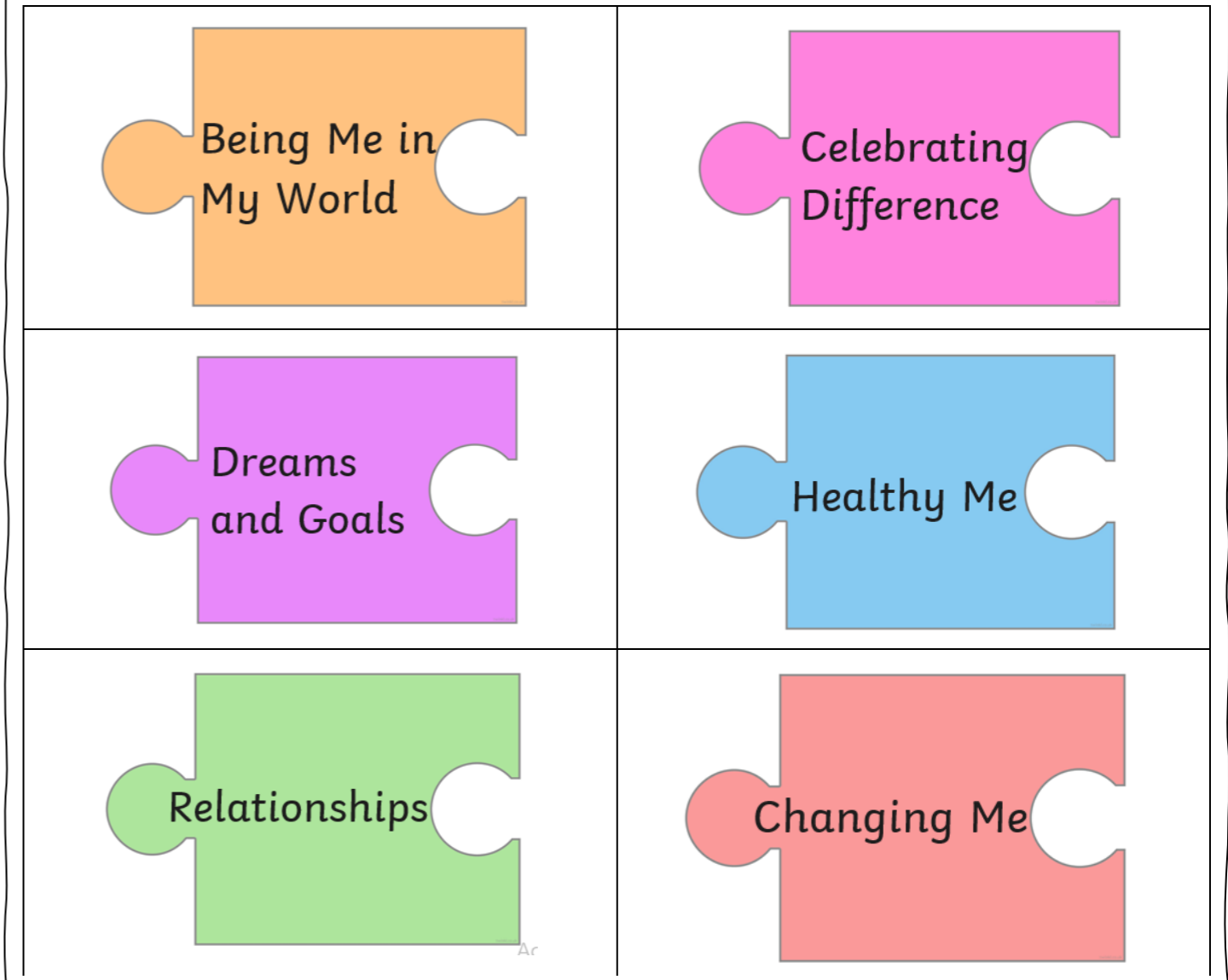
We aim to;
