

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW SPRING TERM 2 EYFS

This half term Hedgehogs will be learning all about Growth and Change

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

We will continue our learning about growth and change, this half term focusing on the lifecycles of different animals, and how plants grow and change. We will be talking in full sentences about all the things we have noticed. We will also be looking at our own personal growth and change.

I ITERACY

We will be doing loads of writing this half term! We will be learning the structure of stories and begin to write our own stories. We will be focusing on writing sentences that can be read by others, and on forming letters correctly.

MATHS

This term we will be continuing our learning about counting forwards and backwards. We will be learning our number bonds to 5. We will be learning to subtract numbers and practicing our addition We will also be looking at different ways to measure things.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Our Jigsaw piece this half term is called 'Healthy Me' and focuses on keeping healthy and safe. We will be thinking about how we can keep our bodies healthy. Why do we need to exercise and eat healthy foods. We will also be looking at our oral health.

UNDERSTANDING OF THE WORLD

We will have lots of visitors to our classroom this half term - some caterpillars that we will watch turn into butterflies and hopefully some frogspawn that will hatch into tadpoles.

We will be growing some plants and looking at how they change over time as well as learning their names and different parts.

In RE we will be learning about Easter and why it is an important time for Christians. We will look at symbols of Easter and learn what they mean. We will also be learning about Holi and Ramadan.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN

This half term we are learning about observational art and still life. We will look at the artists Paul Cezanne, Georgia O'Keefe, and Vincent Van Gogh.

We will be looking closely at things we can see and carefully choosing the colours we need. We will go outside and sketch some of the signs of spring we can see.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

We will be continuing our learning about keeping our bodies healthy in lots of different ways.

In PE we will be focusing on dance skills and balancing.

MUSIC

During this topic we will be learning some mini-beast songs and will perform them with a variety of instruments.

LITERACY

- Can you practice your new phonics sounds? Can you say all of them very quickly? Can you write them down?
- Can you write your own fact file?
- Can you write a sentence by yourself?

MATHS

- Can you find some things in your house that are taller than you? How about shorter than you? What can you use to measure them?
- Choose a number (maybe 4 or 5) and see if you can find all of the ways to make that number. 4 is made of 1 and 3 and 2 and 2. You can draw this to help you or use some objects at home.
- Can you practise writing your numbers to 10?
- Can you have a go at some additional and subtraction questions.
