

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW SPRING TERM 2 EYFS

This half term Hedgehogs will be learning all about Growth and Change

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

We will be learning about what happens on farms, and where the food we eat comes from. We will be talking about our favourite foods and expressing our preferences. We will be learning new vocabulary related to farmyards.

I ITERACY

We will be reading stories and non-fiction books that help us gain knowledge about animals and farm-yards and life cycles. We will begin writing short sentences using our phonic knowledge.

MATHS

This term we will be continuing our learning about number bonds to 5 and extend these to 10. We will be focusing on counting forwards and backwards. We will also be looking at different ways to measure things.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Our Jigsaw piece this half term is called 'Healthy Me' and focuses on keeping healthy and safe. We will be setting ourselves simple goals to work towards and talking about being patient and waiting for things to happen.

UNDERSTANDING OF THE WORLD

We will have lots of visitors to our classroom this half term - some caterpillars that we will watch turn into butterflies and hopefully some frogspawn that will hatch into tadpoles.

We will be growing some plants and looking at how they change over time as well as learning their names and different parts.

In RE we will be learning about Easter and why it is an important time for Christians. We will look at symbols of Easter and learn what they mean.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN

This half term we are learning about observational art and still life. We will look at the artists Paul Cezanne, Georgia O'Keefe, and Vincent Van Gogh.

We will be looking closely at things we can see and carefully choosing the colours we need. We will go outside and sketch some of the signs of spring we can see.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

We will be continuing our learning about keeping our bodies healthy in lots of different ways.

In PE we will be focusing on dance skills and balancing.

MUSIC

During this topic we will be learning some animal songs, and will perform them with a variety of instruments.








