

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW SUMMER TERM 1 YEAR 1

This half term Owls and Woodpeckers will be learning all about ANIMALS.

ENGLISH

We will link our learning to the book 'Meerkat Mail', we are exploring the text using our prediction and inference skills. We will be writing our own post cards too. We will also look at animals through our non-fiction texts.

MATHS

We will be learning about measuring and comparing weights and capacities as well as calculations and counting to 100. We will also be learning about finding half and quarter of a shape and number.

SCIENCE

The topic for this term is animals. We will learn about different animals and what classification they belong to. We will learn how animals stay alive.

HUMANITIES

In GEOGRAPHY we will be learning about the United Kingdom. We will learn about England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales, and we will decide if we like living in the UK. We will use maps to find these places and learn about capital cities.

PSHE

We will be learning about Relationships. We will learn about how to have positive relationships/friendships and overcome issues.

MUSIC

We will be thinking about using our imagination with a variety of pieces of music and building on our previous skills.

COMPUTING

We will continue using Scratch Jr to programme our own games. We will change the sprites and the background.

PF

We have two PE lessons a week Owls have PE on a Wednesday and Thursday; Woodpeckers have PE on a Tuesday and Thursday.


We will be looking and playing net and wall games. We will then look at invasion games. We will be developing our teamwork, perseverance, resilience and aiming skills.






BOOKS WE WILL BE READING

ENGLISH
