# Parent Survey

#### We will:

- Continue to have an open-door policy at all times, if you wish to find out how your child
  is progressing at a different point in the year to parents' meetings and reports, please
  speak to your child's class teacher and they will arrange a time to speak to you.
- Hold more parent workshops to share curriculum and the children's learning.
- Have a termly meet the SLT parent sessions to discuss the behaviour policy and any concerns that parents may have.

### Pupil Survey

Most of the children surveyed said:

- They enjoyed school, felt safe and enjoyed coming to school.
- They were encouraged to look after their physical, emotional, and mental health thought.
- They that they behave well, other children are friendly, and they know that they could talk to an adult if they were worried at school.
- They also though they worked hard in lessons, learnt new things, and said the adults showed then how to make their work better.














### We will:
